### **ACADEMY OF REHABILITATIVE AUDIOLOGY AWARD OF HONOR TO DR. EDWARD J. HARDICK**

- WHEREAS, Dr. Edward J. Hardick has served as Editor of the *Journal of the Academy of Rehabilitative Audiology* from 1968 until 1976, and
- WHEREAS, he was program chair of the ARA Summer Institute in 1973, and
- WHEREAS, he was president of the Academy of Rehabilitative Audiology in 1974, and
- WHEREAS, he has served in various capacities continuously on the Executive Committee of the Academy from 1970 until 1982, and
- WHEREAS, he has served continuously as an active member of a committee or a committee chair since 1968, and
- WHEREAS, his testimony before the Food and Drug Administration on auditory training units has influenced positively regulations promulgated by that Federal agency, and
- WHEREAS, his publications in the field of aural rehabilitation have contributed significantly to the body of literature in this field of study, and
- WHEREAS, during the tenure of his membership in the Academy of Rehabilitative Audiology, he has functioned as an advisor, professional consultant, and friend and counselor for both the Academy and individual members of the Academy, and
- WHEREAS, he is recognized nationally not only as a clinician, but also as a researcher and educator, and
- WHEREAS, Dr. Hardick's activities within the Academy of Rehabilitative Audiology have been continuous and exemplary throughout a period of 15 years; therefore
- RESOLVED, That the Award of Honor of the Academy of Rehabilitative Audiology be presented to Edward J. Hardick, Ph.D. for dedicated service and meritorious contributions.
